PIV Synod 2018

Episcopal Church leaders to give GC preview

The Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church, the Most Rev. Michael Curry, will head up a trio of Episcopal Church leaders to give the Province IVSynod a preview and general orientation of Genral Convention this summer.


Joining the Presiding Bishop will be the Rev. Gay Clark Jennings, President of the House of Deputies, and the Rev. Canon Michael Barlowe, Executive Officer of the General Convention.

The Province IV 2018 Synod will be held Wednesday - Friday, June 6-8, at Kanuga Conferences, near Hendersonville, N.C.

The 79th General Convention will be held in Austin, Texas, July 5-13.

In addition to the preview of General Convention, the Province will elect officers for the next Triennium, 2019-2021. Offices to be filled by election are President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and lay representative to Executive Council.

President Angela Daniel will complete her second term as president and is ineligible for another term. The Rt. Rev. Don Johnson will be completing his term as Vice President, but

because he has announced his intention to retire, will not be seeking another term in this office. Tess Judge will be stepping down as Province IV's lay representative to Executive Council after six years of service, and is ineligible to serve again in that role.

In addition, the Synod will nominate three lay persons and three clergy persons for the Joint Nominating Committee To Elect a Presiding Bishop. Then at General Convention during the Provincial Caucuses, the Province will narrow that list

to two persons in each order. Then the full General Convention will elect one person in each order to serve on the committee. This committee typically will not meet unless the Presiding Bishop cannot continue to serve in that office; then the committee will convene to determine a way forward for replacing the Presiding Bishop. (In the last triennium of the Presiding Bishop's tenure, the committee then becomes a very vital group in that it functions as a church-wide "search committee." That will not occur for another three years.)

The links for the offices to be filled, the job descriptions for each, and an online Nomination Form are all found on the home page of the Province IV website: **www.provinceiv.org**.

Also at Synod, the Province will meet the official Youth Presence at General Convention — Helena Upshaw from the Episcopal Church in South Carolina, and Justin Mullis of the Diocese of North Carolina.

PIV 2018 Ministry Grants awarded

rovince IVhas awarded \$18,700 in miistry grants for 2018 to two projects that can become evangelistic models of ministry for parish planning and another for hands-on rehabilitative art for the homeless.

The DataStory Evangelism Project, sponsored by the Dioceses of Central Gulf Coast and Georgia, received a grant of \$10,500. The funds will be used for trainers to learn and, in turn, teach how to use a demographic missional context analysis process and then help dioceses and congregations to understand and engage the communities they are called to serve.

The second grant for \$8,200, goes to Southside Abby

Partners in Art in Chattanooga, Tenn., in the Diocese of East Tennessee. The project is aimed at people experiencing homelessness or severe economic vulnerability. It would offer classes (art, pottery, photography, etc.) and the resulting artwork would be for sale on the abby's website. Revenues would be shared between the artist and the program.

"We are so fortunate to have such strong missional ministries in our Province," said Province IV President Angela Daniel. "It is our intent to invite the ministries to a future Synod where they can share their work — their successes and their challenges — with others in the Province."

UTO has new supplies distributor

The United Thank Offering has a new distributor for our supplies. All supplies can be ordered through https://shimaofnavajoland.com/ We hope this change will not only solve some shipping issues that occurred in the past, but it also helps support the Diocese of Navajoland. Additionally, a number of Navajo products, made possible by UTO grants, are available

Four grants were issued this year to seminarian students and Province IV has an association with all four. Sara Oxley, Diocese of Central Florida, and Caroline Carson, Diocese of Louisiana, were both awarded grants at their respective schools. Also, Leon Sampson and Nobet Ayeebo from

Virginia Theological Seminary were given grants. Kathryn Florack, Diocese of Western North Carolina, was awarded a young adult grant as well. Good job Province IV! Please keep these grant opportunities in mind in the future and pass it on to your contacts.

During the last granting cycle, the UTO Board offered two webinars for the young adult/seminarian grants and 4 webinars for the regular grants. All were well attended. The webinar information is published with the applications and is a very good resource for grant writers, UTO coordinators, anyone who serves on a grant committee or just has an interest in UTO. UTO also offers webinars in the fall to help provide information to new coordinators. Details regarding the webinars can be found on the blog site, https://uto2014.wordpress.com/. The blog site also has a complete list of all the grants that have been awarded and numerous resources for your parish and diocese.

The United Thank Offering Board is getting ready for Triennial and we plan to spend our time promoting the practice of

PYE in Atlanta

On July 25 - 28, the Province IV Youth Event, "PYE 2018: A Service Learning Opportunity for Peace" will be held in the Diocese of Atlanta. This Province IV High School Youth Experience will serve other people and communities will serve PYE 2018 in Atlanta... recognizing God's love within all of God's people. The focus of our week will be recognizing God's Presence in the world and identifying how we can we show God's love within our world. Some of our service partners will be Church of the Common Ground where we will be serving breakfast, leading morning prayer, and working at their foot clinic. At Holy Comforter, we will be serving in their kitchen and in their community garden.

We will be working with Smart Kid Smart Lunch by making lunches and delivering these lunches to children who are on assisted school lunch programs. At the Midtown Assistance Center, we will be working with clients, making lunches, and entering data for them. At the Atlanta Community Food Bank, we will be volunteering in the Disaster Relief Center and we will be loading donations for delivery.

After serving the community each day, we will spend each evening reflecting on that day's experience. Another part of our reflection time will be working with "Posts for Peace." We will explore the various aspects of "PEACE" and we will share ideas of how we can be instruments of peace within Atlanta, back in our home communities, and in our world. We will be creating works of art using six-foot posts that will be displayed across our country to raise awareness and to stimulate conversations

that will lead to peace and that will help resolve injustice in our world. You can find more information about "Posts for Peace" at www.postsforpeaceandjustice.org. Continuing LEV

During our 2017 Province IV Youth Ministries Leadership and Network Meeting, Beth Crow, Lead Youth Missioner in the Diocese of North Carolina, and youth who had participated in "Lift Every Voice" (LEV), invited youth and adults who were interested in continuing the work that was begun through LEV to join together in conversations to dream about how Province IV could help facilitate possible next steps. This group of youth and adults have continued to stay in touch with each other through conference calls and they are working on plans for a visioning retreat in Atlanta several days prior to the Provincial Youth Event this summer. The group hopes to participate in some training at the recently opened The Absalom Jones Episcopal Center For Racial Healing in Atlanta, developing a stronger foundation for future youth/young adult initiatives focused on social injustice.

Ideas that the group have discussed include a Civil Rights Pilgrimage in 2019, with training in Non-Violent Communication skills, developing a database on ministries for young people in social justice, and establishment of a Provincial training network for youth and young adults to help lead diocesan programs. Further dreams involve incorporating connections with some of our companion dioceses, like "Lift Every Voice" did with Botswana and Cape Town. Most importantly, the youth want to continue to be empowered to address the social injustices in our communities which seem to have intensified over the last few years.

Building a network of support

Grace for Creation Council advances

The work of building a network of support and cooperation for creation care in Province IV continues to advance. In response to the call for the creation of such groups at General Convention in 2015 (Resolution A030), an initial steering

group has been formed from nominees from the Province IV dioceses and other recommendations. The steering group has had an initial meeting and planning retreat in Sewanee, Tenn., and continues to meet monthly via video conference. After a good bit of discussion toward defining scope and purpose for such a group, the name **Grace for Creation Council** was selected to capture the nature and purpose of its work.

its work to General Convention (Blue Book, 2018):

- 1. Grace for Creation Council: A steering committee responsible for building, supporting, connecting, promoting, empowering the Grace for Creation Network, and
- 2. Grace for Creation Network: A community of support, comprised of groups

and individuals around the Province who have gifts and expertise that can support creation care in Province IV and the whole church

Council's networking

The Grace for Creation Council will act as a source for vision, scope and procedure for building and extending the Grace for Creation network. Members of that committee will meet online at least monthly and will be comprised of individuals from across the province with a passion for this work. The Grace for Creation Network will be comprised of the people with gifts, talents or expertise for the various dimensions of caring for creation and are willing to act as a resource to the work from time to time. Such gifts and skills would include expertise in environmental science, engineering, law, biology, climate, etc.; gifts and expertise in church life, theology, music, liturgy, spirituality, etc.; and gifts and expertise in advocacy, community organizing, policy, etc.

The scope and purpose of Grace for Creation Council and Network is not to be to be a source of creating new initiatives and programs, but rather to be a resource to the individuals, churches and other organizations doing such work in Province IV. The help available to individuals and ministries could include consulting and support around teaching, organizing, planning, programming, promotion, worship and liturgy, etc. It is the hope and prayer of Grace for Creation Council that these types of support and resources would serve to enliven the church and our communities in this important work.

ECW Annual Retreat set June 4-6

The Province IV ECW will hold its annual retreat June 4-6 at Kanuga, with the Rev. Dr. Sandra McCann of the Diocese of Atlanta and Tanzania, as the keynote speaker

and priest. "Building Bridges of Peace and Reconciliation" is the continuing theme; this year, the focus will be on building bridges in the country and in the world.

Dr. McCann lived and worked in Dodoma, Tanzania, in the Anglican Diocese of Central Tanganyika, for more than 12 years with her husband, Martin (also a physician), where she served as communications director for Msalato Theological College, as well as fulfilling other McCann roles there. She also served St.



Philip's Theological College in Maseno, Kenya. She is a priest, tutor, radiologist, assistant professor, chaplain, communications director, mother, wife, and grandmother.

The Martins returned to the United States in 2015 to the Diocese of Atlanta.

In 2016 Virginia Theological Seminary awarded her an honorary doctor in divinity, degree (honoris causa) She had earned her Master in Divinity degree from VTS in 2003. Earlier, she attended the School of Servant Leadership as part of the mission of the Church of the Savior in Adams Morgan area of Washington, D.C.

The retreat will also offer opportunities for workshops to assist individuals with diocesan and parish ECW chapters, as well as time for recreation and fellowship.
