Our retreat leader this year is no stranger to HIV/AIDS. Bruce Garner has been continuously involved in some form of HIV/AIDS-related ministry and activism since 1984 when, as he puts it, "I felt that annoying tapping on my shoulder telling me I had work to do around the horror of AIDS." Bruce has chaired and served on numerous grassroots and national HIV organizations, including the Ryan White Planning Council for Metro Atlanta, the National Episcopal AIDS Coalition, AID Atlanta, Jerusalem House, AIDS Treatment Initiatives, the Episcopal Church's Commission on HIV/AIDS and more. Bruce has also served on the planning team of this very retreat for over 2 decades—and he has been living with HIV himself for over 33 years. Clearly, it's a remarkable journey that brings Bruce Garner to us, and he comes with Jesus' radical invitation echoing in his heart and on his lips: "Let your light so shine."

Known as one of the country's brightest talents in the field of organ performance, Trey Clegg is hailed for his versatile abilities to play, sing, and conduct in a variety of genres. Trey is Organist/Choirmaster at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Atlanta and has grown the music ministry there to be the largest volunteer choir in the Episcopal Church nationwide.
